PARTICULARS OF ITS ORGANISATION, FUNCTIONS & DUTIES

1.0 INTRODUCTION

National Small Industries Corporation (NSIC) Ltd., an ISO-9001 certified Company, was established by the Government of India in 1955. The strategic objectives, for which the Corporation was established, included "to aid, counsel, assist, finance, protect and promote the interest of small industries in India." With enactment of the Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises Development (MSMED) Act, 2006, medium enterprises also came into its ambit.

2.0 ORGANISATIONAL SET-UP

The Policy guidelines to the Corporation are provided by the Board of Directors consisting of a full time Chairman-cum-Managing Director; two Functional Directors; two Government Nominee Directors, one SIDBI Nominee Director and six Non-official Part-time Directors. The Corporation has a dedicated team of professionals at all levels and operates through 123 offices located all over India and one office located at Johannesburg (South Africa).
